UP THE CHISHOLM TRAIL CATTLE DRIVE AND CHUCKWAGON COOK-OFF

- Friday and Saturday, September 17 & 18, 2010, at San Gabriel Park in Georgetown, Texas
- You can check in as early as the late afternoon of Thursday, September 16, 2010.
- Overnight camping in the park is allowed for this event (Thursday through Saturday nights); however, there are **no hook-ups** of any kind in the park. Generators are acceptable, but only at night.
- Please enter San Gabriel Park from East Morrow Street
- \$100 entry fee, refundable upon arrival at event
- The Williamson Museum will provide meat, potatoes, beans, fruit, onions, flour, sugar, oil, eggs and milk, as well as containers for food judging and serving to the public/sponsors
- Each wagon will prepare peach cobbler dessert samples with a team of up to 2 kids for 40 people as the kids' cooking competition as well as to be served to the public at 7:30 pm on Friday, September 17
- **All food must be prepared on site on wood fires** (no charcoal allowed)—only sourdough starter is allowed, no other pre-mixes allowed
- Bring your own cooking wood for cooking on Friday and Saturday
- Maximum crew size allowed is **six**, including the head cook (name all crew members on entry form)—these persons only may be in camp and involved in the food preparation and cooking until after the food samples are turned in.
- Crews must be in period costume during the entire event. Jeans must be period appropriate.
- Dutch oven liners will be allowed
- Advertising on the wagons will not be allowed
- Wagons must be checked in and set up by 12:00 pm on Friday, September 18, as wagon judging starts at 1:00 pm
- Wagons will be judged as Trail Wagons
- Distribution of food items is Friday, September 17, as soon as wagon judging is completed
- Cooks may begin food preparation upon receipt of food items
- Each wagon will be provided with food and is expected to prepare 40 full meals for Saturday, September 18
- Each wagon should be prepared to have judging food ready to be taken to the Judging Station at 1:00 pm on Saturday, September 18—dinner bell is at 1:15 on Saturday, September 18
- Awards ceremony will be held Saturday, September 18, after the cattle drive—approximately 4:00-4:30 pm
